However, the number of child beneficiaries did not decrease significantly. This year, we expect the number to increase as we welcome new beneficiaries from other regions of the country to our programmes.

We are also adding a few other projects in 2023 that will, hopefully, encourage our young beneficiaries to start thinking about the career paths they wish to embark on. I am proud to watch as our beneficiaries, especially our older ones, are growing up with a mindset to help and be of service. And I can say this confidently, every child who is with M-Kids is an educated child, fully aware of the world around them. And we do everything in our power to ensure they have a bright future.

Speaking of numbers, Our Education Programme reached approximately 2,158 beneficiaries ranging from 4 to 18 years old. We touched some 21,543 beneficiaries through our Poverty Alleviation Programme.



About 158 beneficiaries (including a few parents) had at least one session with the psychologist(s). And our newly implemented Youth and the Environment Programme now consists of 11 beneficiaries.

Once again, it is my pleasure to present the M-Kids' Annual Report 2022 to you. It is a testimony of the phenomenal work that we have been doing.

On behalf of everyone at M-Kids, I would like to take this opportunity to express my heartfelt gratitude to everyone who has supported us and encouraged us.

## OUR MISSION

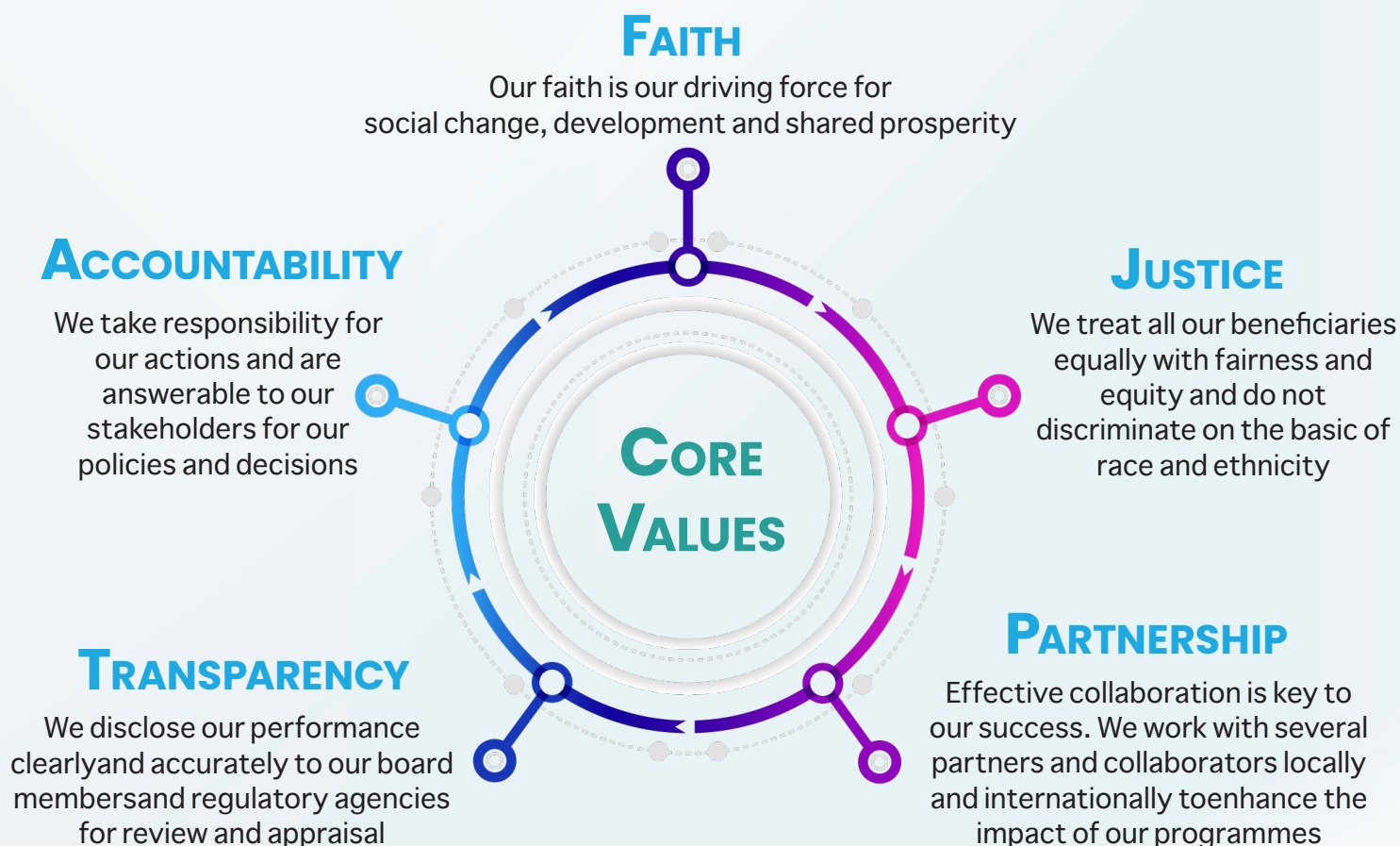

- And the most vulnerable children are afforded protection and opportunities through affirmative policies and actions.





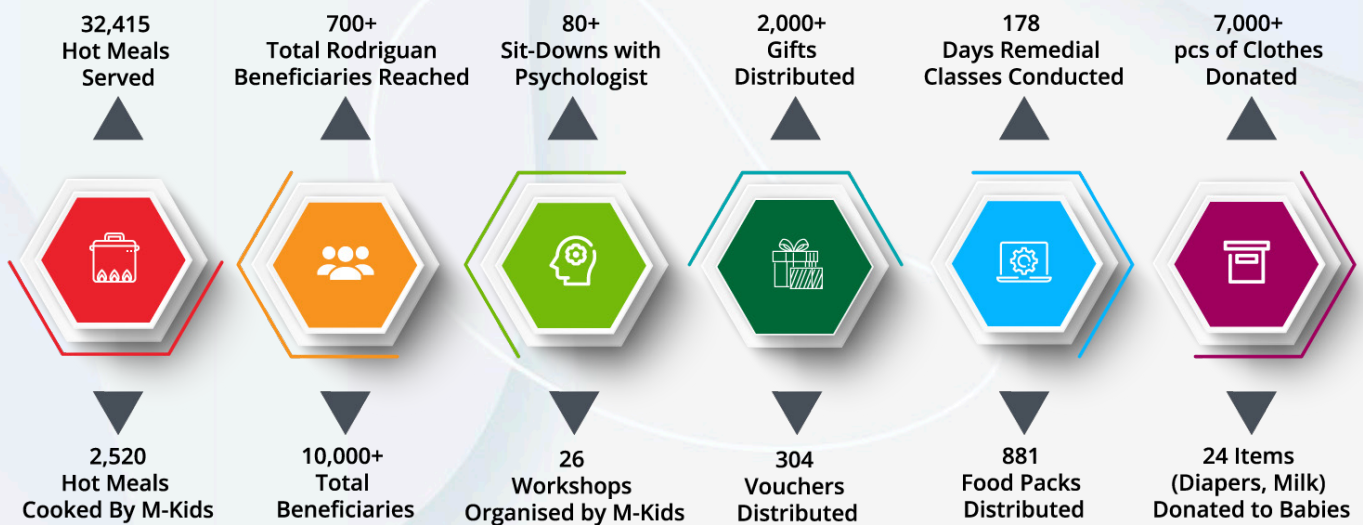
# ORGANISATIONAL CHART

## GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE

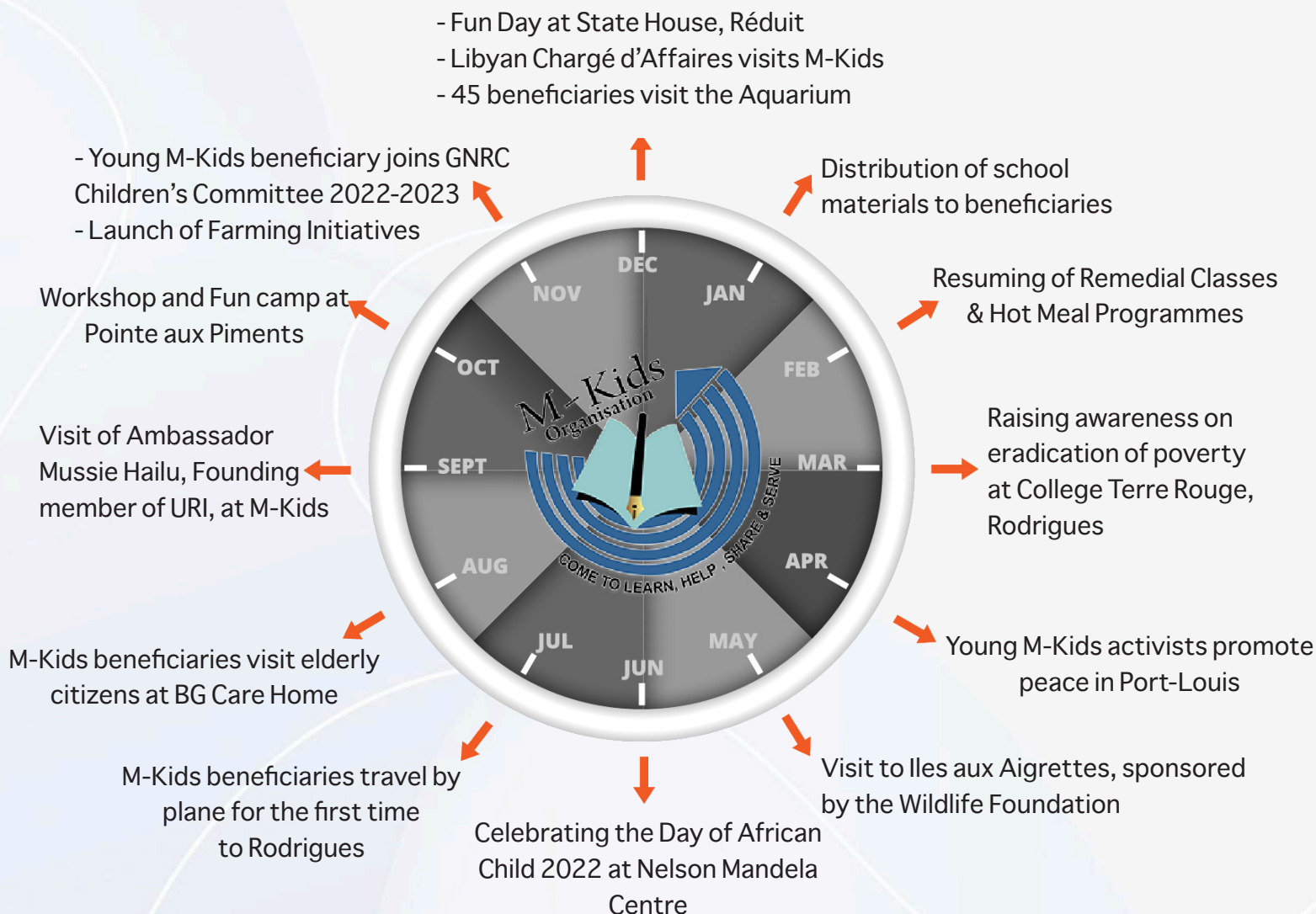

# EDUCATION PROGRAM

## AFTERSCHOOL REMEDIAL CLASSES [CASE STUDY]

The ARP is one of our most successful programmes designed to empower vulnerable children through quality education.

The inspiring story of S.G. is a strong signal that the work M-Kids is driving positive change in the lives of our beneficiaries.

The problem of illiteracy persists in Mauritius. Too many times, low performers who need individual attention from their teachers at school are sent to the back of the classroom and ignored.

When S.G. reached 6th grade for PSAC, he could not read or do basic math. The teacher was appalled at his inability to read second-grade words or maths. He had issues following the class and catching up with the rest of the students. S.G. is the eldest child in a family of two and comes from a modest family with both parents holding low-income jobs.

Even though S.G. has been with M-Kids for some years, it was only in 2020 that he joined the Remedial Classes. With Covid-19 lockdowns and severely limited access to technology worsened his situation. Without the guidance of a teacher, even classes through the television had little impact.

Other children laughing at him for not knowing the right answers was a strong factor that demotivated him.

When S.G. joined M-Kids, the teacher gave him individual attention and spent extra time teaching him all the basics, assisted him and followed his progress closely. S.G. also spoke to the psychologist. Slowly, S.G. gradually improved in his studies and he passed his PSAC!

M-Kids' objective is to ensure that no child is left behind. A primary certificate education has become a must in today's world. And the aim of Remedial Classes is to empower every vulnerable child through a solid education.

The 2022 Remedial Classes were partly sponsored by the SBM Foundation.

- 132 students enrolled in 2022
- 9 students enrolled in Enhancement Programme classes
- 100% pass for PSAC
- 84% average attendance rate
- 14,000 were hours spent teaching beneficiaries





# DISTRIBUTION OF SCHOOL MATERIALS

In 2022, M-Kids supported more than 200 vulnerable young students by providing them with basic school materials to help them in their academic journey.

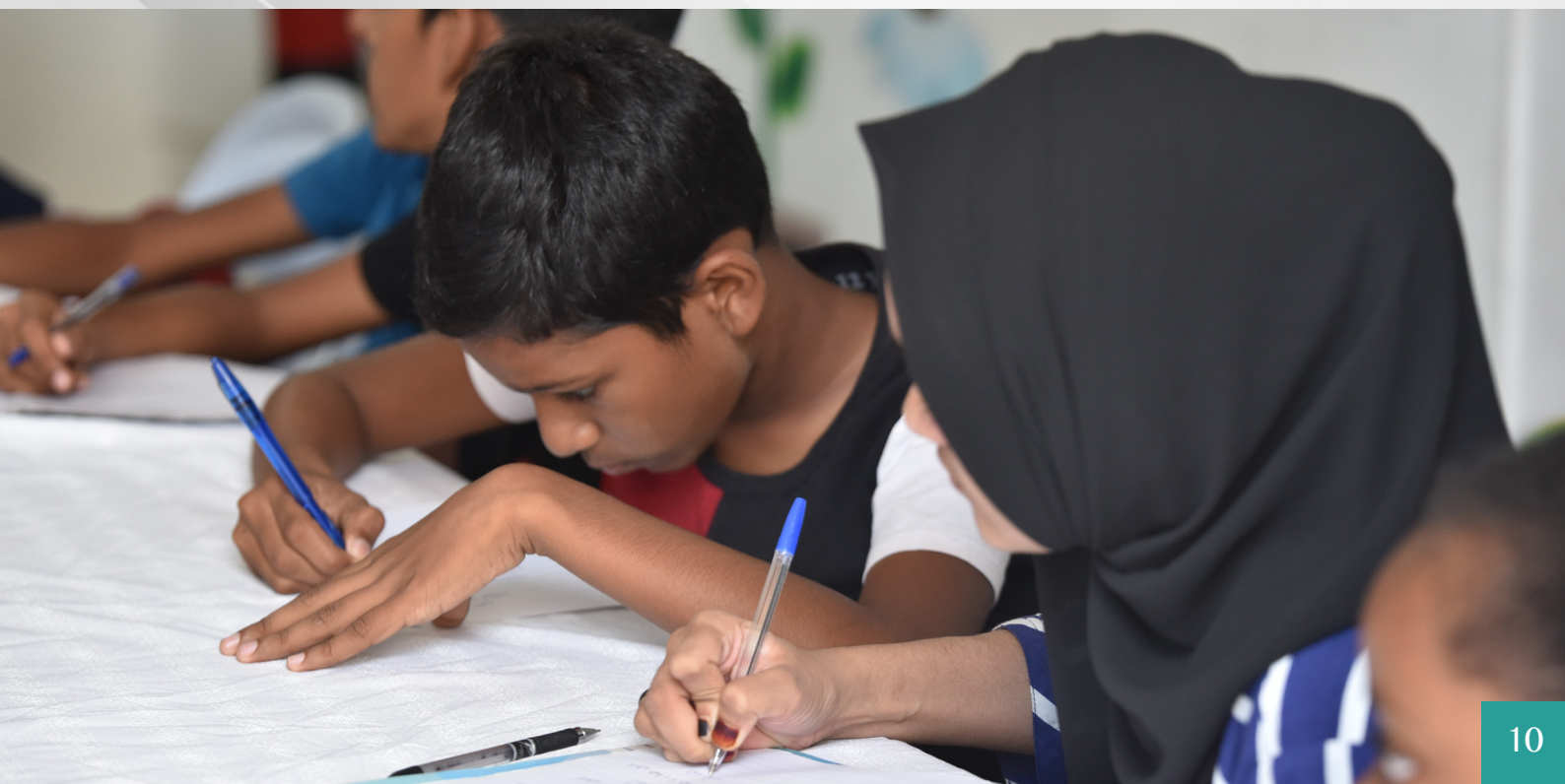
School materials are our children's tools to succeed at school. The average cost of notebooks, stationery, uniforms, books, shoes, and so on can reach up to Rs 5,000 per child in Mauritius.

Parents/guardians with limited revenues with a few dependents find it very difficult to make both ends meet.

The generosity of various sponsors (Aquarelle Group, Eagle Brand, etc.) reached over 200 vulnerable beneficiaries.



- 4,390 school materials distributed
- 100 school materials packs distributed to Rodriguan children
- 250+ beneficiaries





# CAPACITY-BUILDING WORKSHOPS

A child's brain needs continuous challenges and activities to develop a series of skills including but not limited to creative thinking, critical thinking, social skills, ability to adapt and so on.

Our screen-free workshops provide a safe environment for the children to foster a relationship with nature, build their self-esteem, nurture friendships, learn to respect differences, and give them a sense of purpose in their life.

*The brain's ability to adapt to its environment, learn, and acquire new skills continues throughout life ...Thus investments in environmental inputs are needed well beyond early childhood to sustain learning along with skills development.<sup>2</sup>*

## EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

By engaging young people in outdoor activities, we are encouraging them to learn through experience.

Whether it is through educational games, role-playing, or children-led activities or even field trips, our beneficiaries are fully engaged.

For children, experiential learning is a necessary step as they must challenge themselves by thinking and engaging in internal reflection, sometimes, even questioning their emotional responses. It is the best way for young children to build their self-confidence and leadership skills.

A group of beneficiaries between 15 to 18 years old organised and planned an Adventurous journey based on the Duke of Edinburg Award. They started their trip at Pointe aux Piments and walked all the way to Mont Choisy where they set up camp for the night. During this journey, the young adventurers learned organisation, route-planning, setting up tents, and respecting nature.

# EDUCATIONAL TRIP TO RODRIGUES

Travelling is a wonderful way for children to discover the world and expand their mindset. In July 2022, eight young beneficiaries were gifted a trip to Rodrigues for being exemplary model students and participants. The aim of the trip, additionally, was to provide the children with a well-deserved break and encourage them to leave their comfort zone for the first time.

Rodrigues, in all its simplicity, was the perfect destination for the children. The pilot project was very successful as the beneficiaries learned about the importance of bees and bee-keeping, artisanal crafts, geography, history of Rodrigues and Mauritius and so on.

Besides the educational benefits, the trip was instrumental in building confidence and igniting a spark of interest in the young beneficiaries.

# POVERTY ALLEVIATION PROGRAMME

## SHARE-A-MEAL [CASE STUDY]

M-Kids' Share-A-Meal scheme has been running successfully for its eighth year now. The scheme is one of one of M-Kids' most successful initiatives.

The aim of the Share-A-Meal scheme is to reduce adverse childhood experiences, provide support for vulnerable children, and strengthen the family unit.

S.D. is the last child of seven siblings and is around 11 years old. Her parents, despite their old age, are still working as a mason and a factory worker to feed the family.



The combined income they receive at the end of the month is never enough, despite the efforts that both parents have been putting in to feed their dependents.

S.D.'s parents are both reaching their sixties. While they are putting in a lot of effort, the limited income, low energy, and life after Covid have not been favourable. Especially as the parents often have to come home late nearly every day of the week.

Therefore, M-Kids has been supporting the family through the Share-A-Meal scheme, which provides vulnerable children with a hot meal every evening. This ensures that every child has a healthy, hot meal before they go to bed every night.

Additionally, the Association helps the family through food packs, clothes, school materials for minors and other items that they need, or visits to the doctor.

The Share-A-Meal scheme removes the responsibility of the house from the shoulders of young carers, which can be quite stressful and hindering. By freeing up their time, young children can thus focus on their studies and hobbies. M-Kids' Share-A-Meal scheme grants a normal childhood for vulnerable children, who would have otherwise been burdened with household responsibilities.

- 114 child beneficiaries
- 3,500+ hours donated by M-Kids' Food Programme Team

## MEAT & FISH DISTRIBUTION

As prices of meat, and food in general, continue to rise in 2022, generous donors provided the organisation with chicken, fish, meat and fruits to be distributed to vulnerable families.

Without any doubt, for many families on low-income thresholds, the meat and fruits they receive occasionally are a luxury.

- 1,080 kgs of meat distributed
- 175 kgs fish distributed
- 51 kgs chicken distributed
- 200 kgs of fruits donated





# MONTHLY SOCIAL SUPPORT AID



In the Year 2022, M-Kids continued to support vulnerable families. On top of the repercussions of Covid that can still be felt, prices have continued to skyrocket with no signs of slowing down. And unfortunately, salary increases have not been significant enough to alleviate the suffering of many families.

To ensure that children, parents or families do not fall into severe poverty, we regularly provide them with food packs, vouchers, and other necessary items.

- 304 vouchers distributed
- 881 food packs distributed

## MEDICAL APPEALS

For too many, limited revenue is a serious barrier to healthcare, even though it is free. This barrier can be in the form of work, no available sick or casual leaves, no access to transportation, lack of knowledge regarding health maintenance and so on.

In 2022, M-Kids organised general medical check-ups for around 85 beneficiaries.

Following this, around 60 children were brought to visit a dentist. Thirty of them are now being closely monitored and regularly advised by the generous and kind-hearted dentist.

We also provided assistance to some 13 individuals who needed urgent medical interventions both locally and abroad.

# MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAMME

## PSYCHOTHERAPY [CASE STUDY]

The presence of a psychologist has been a turning point in the lives of our beneficiaries. Many distressed children did not have anyone to turn to to express their feelings or confide in. Bottling negative thoughts and feelings can affect a child nefariously, their studies, their relationships with the people around them.

S.S. is the third child of a family of four children. Her father abandoned the family when she was just two years after learning that his wife was having another daughter. The trauma of witnessing her father being violent persisted for nearly a decade, affecting her studies, her self-confidence and even her interactions with people, as she mostly keeps to herself.

Social anxiety, poor performance in her studies, low self-confidence were all markers that S.S. needed to speak to someone.

M-Kids set up a few meetings with the appointed psychologist. Afterwards, there was visible improvement in S.S.'s demeanour. Not only did S.S. pass her PSAC, but she is now much more relaxed and less anxious.

We have no doubt that the sit-downs with the psychologist were more than helpful. S.S. is definitely more confident. Trauma does not disappear overnight, and the psychologist will continue to follow up with S.S. to ensure she overcomes her traumatic past.

M-Kids will also continue to support her through its other projects, such as remedial classes, Share-A-Meal and psychosocial activities. M-Kids ensures good mental health for everyone and a proper support network for vulnerable children.

This project is supported largely by the Ministry of Health which provided M-Kids with four amazing psychologists (on a rotating basis as from August 2022 to July 2023) to listen to our children.

- 70+ sessions carried out with children.
- 10+ sessions with parents/guardians.







# PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT

Psychosocial support, which can take the form of various activities, is any activity that addresses both the psychological and social needs of an individual.

Beneficiaries from vulnerable backgrounds often go through multiple changes and experience different moods. At M-Kids, we arrange different types of activities that keep the children positively engaged in non-formal learning spaces.

With M-Kids, the children are growing in environments filled with positive influences, feel safe, become resilient and are provided with fun-filled opportunities that push them to think about their future. Most importantly, the children learn to re-establish relationships with their peers and adults, and learn to overcome any negativity that has been weighing them down.

# YOUTH & THE ENVIRONMENT

## FARMING INITIATIVES

M-Kids initiated a new project to introduce farming to our young beneficiaries. Children who grow up in urban settings are often oblivious about the basics of life. The aim of the farming initiative is to raise awareness on the value of food, instil an appreciation for farming and agriculture, and encourage home-grown food.

Farming is a wonderful way to teach young children a wide range of life skills, including but not limited to raising food, working hard, being responsible, caring for nature and so on.

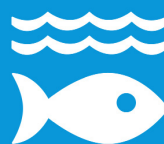
A team of children have been tasked with raising around 15 hens and rearing 2 sheep. It's a job that they take seriously.

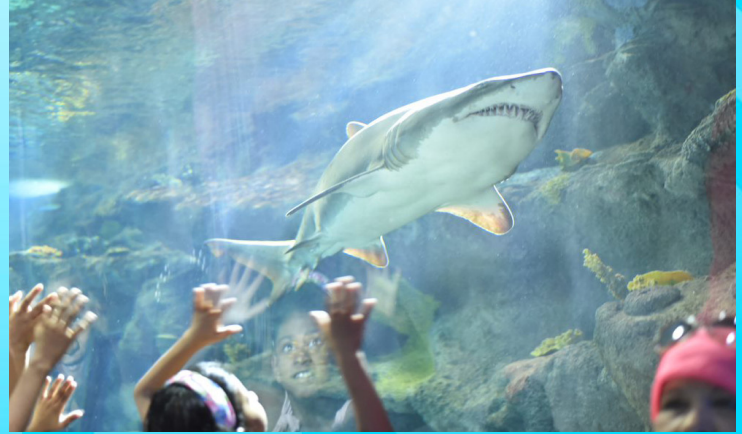

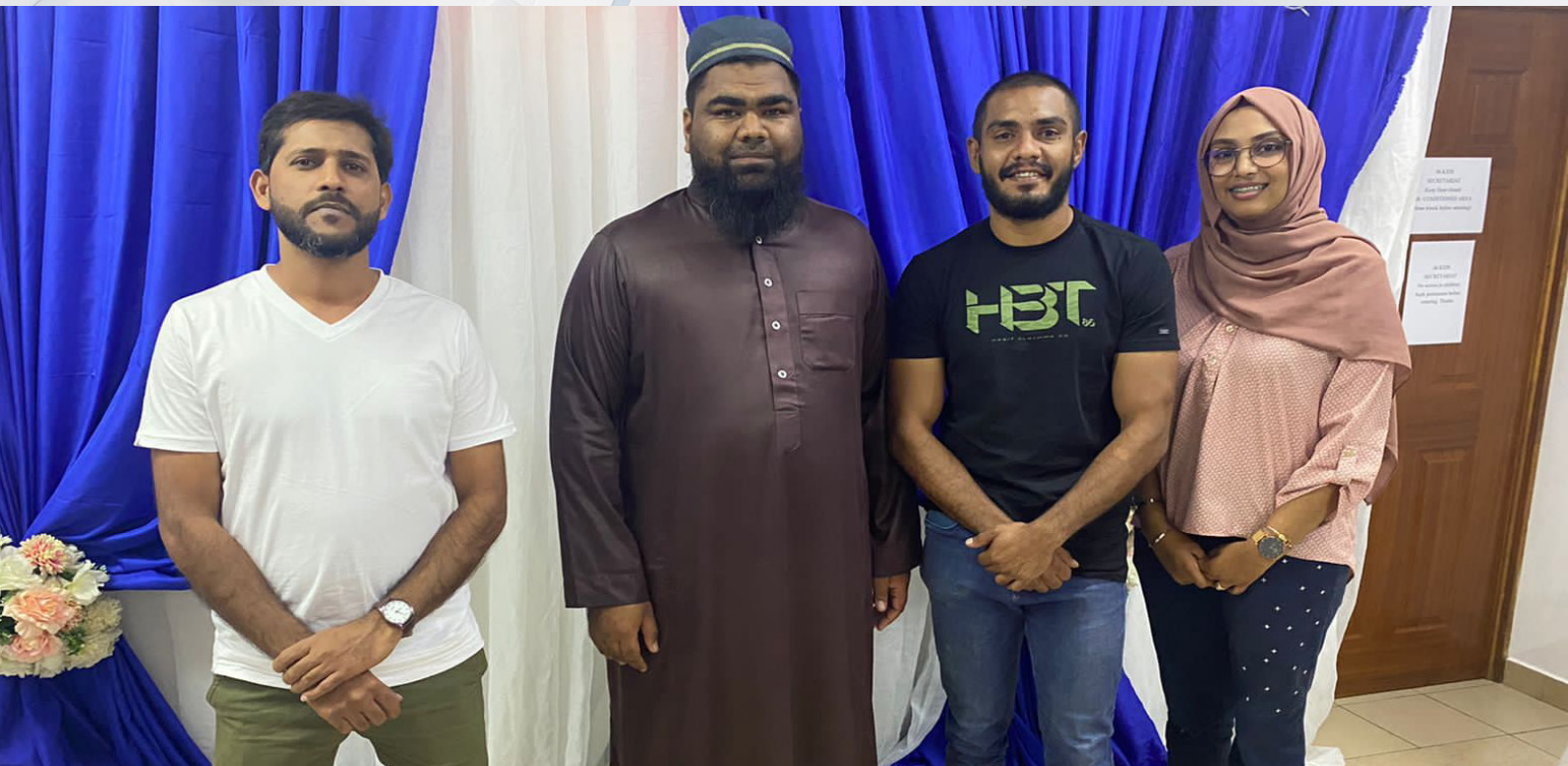
# MISCELLANEOUS ACTIVITIES

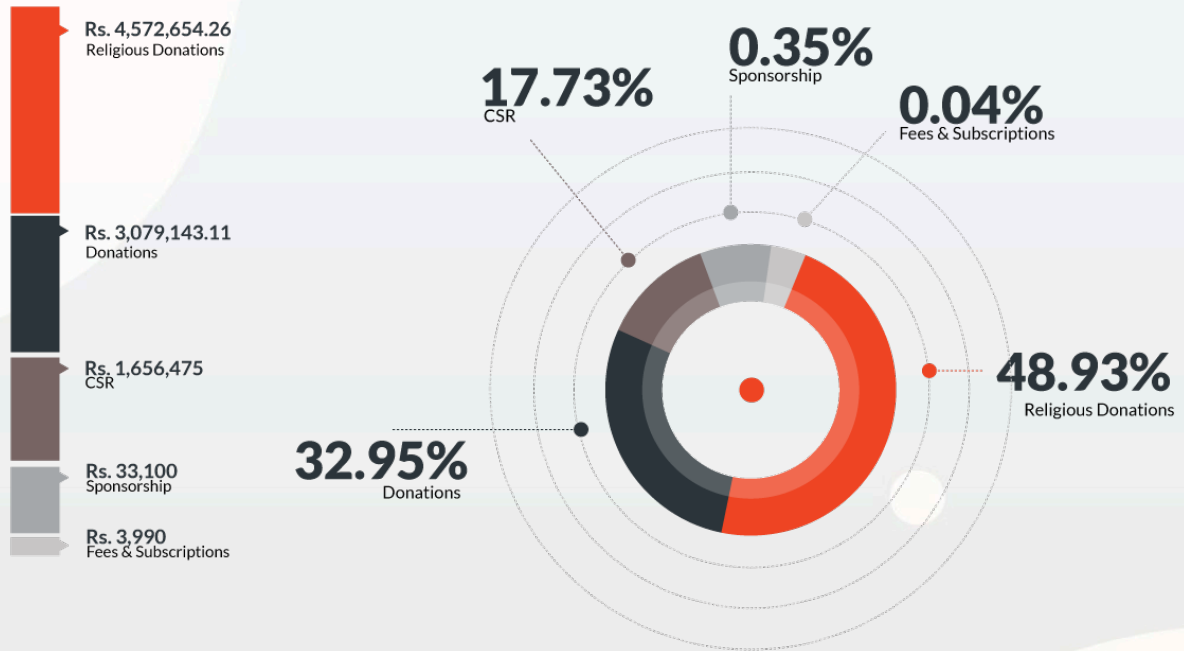

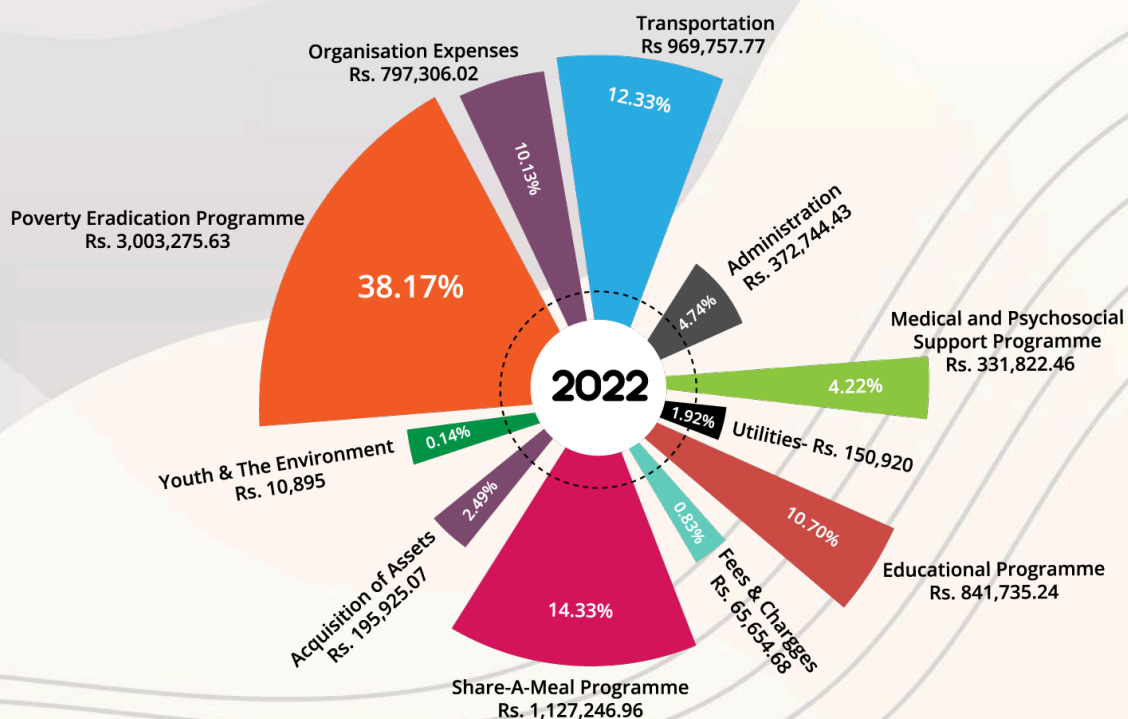


# FINANCIAL INFORMATION 2022

## INCOME – Rs. 9,345,362.37



## EXPENSES – Rs. 7,867,283.26





Year 2022 for M-Kids was quite impactful financially. As usual, the majority of our donors comprised of individuals who contributed generously to advance our projects. Donations by individuals reached an amount of Rs 3,079,143. A total of Rs 33,100 was received to sponsor children in their education.

Seven companies/institutions (SBM Foundation, IQ-EQ, Dream Price, LC Parts, Display Store, etc.) donated a total of Rs 1,635,000 to support our CSR projects which include Afterschool Remedial Classes, Capacity-Building Workshops, IT SmartLab, etc.

Religious donations (zakat, lillah, sadaqah, etc.) amounted to a total of Rs 4,572,654.26. And we've raised Rs 3,990 in membership fees and subscriptions.

Poverty Alleviation Programme expenses covered food packs (Rs 685,218) distributed to vulnerable families, orphan patronage (Rs 21,270), sponsoring of students (Rs 260,255), social housing (Rs 163,005), donations (Rs 1,688,037) including empowerment and life skill trainings, payment of beneficiaries' utilities (Rs 9,000), helpers' stipends (Rs 27,430), and directors' allowances (Rs 149,060).

For the Share-A-Meal Programme, Rs 1,088,794 was spent on hot meals (either purchasing prepared meals or ingredients to prepare hot meals in-house) and the rest was used to pay cooks.

Rs 238,968 was spent on teachers' fees for the Educational Programme, and Rs 293,648 was spent only on capacity-building workshops, and Rs 92,880 was spent to acquire school materials and uniforms for beneficiaries. The remaining amounts, Rs 126,216 and Rs 90,000, were paid to supervisors and project coordinators respectively.

For the Medical and Psychosocial Support Programme, Rs 204,953 was donated to support beneficiaries with urgent medical needs, Rs 45,133 was spent on doctors' and psychologists' fees and Rs 8,301 was spent on medicines. Rs 73,435 was disbursed on psychosocial activities and events.

A total of Rs 10,895 was used to purchase a chicken coop and livestock feed to launch the Farming Initiatives for the Youth & the Environment Programme.

Regarding Transportation expenses, Rs 347,833 was spent on air tickets (Educational Programme, Fundraising, Poverty Alleviation Programme), whilst Rs 261,335 was spent on van and bus rentals.

The drivers' salaries and allowances reached a total of Rs 172,308. Rs 132,525 was disbursed for fuel and Rs 55,757 was spent on insurance, road tax, and vehicle maintenance.

Expenses for the Administration included salaries (Rs 334,445), CSG (Rs 15,730), NSF (Rs 15,492) and PRGF (Rs 14,506). A total of Rs 7,429 was refunded by the HRDC for the YEP Scheme.

For Utilities, Rs 79,375 was spent on electricity and water, and Rs 71,545 was spent on telecommunications.

Fees & Charges included Rs 48,875 for accounting services, Rs 9,305 for bank services, Rs 500 for fees and Rs 6,975 for miscellaneous subscriptions and affiliation fees.

Acquisition of new assets (office equipment, including laptops) reached a total of Rs 195,925.07.

As for Organisation Expenses, the amounts are as follows: Rs 176,800 was spent on rent; Rs 113,555 on cleaning fees; Rs 41,025 on consumables, Rs 76,738 on equipment; Rs 15,086 on postage; Rs 126,283 on repairs and maintenance; Rs 35,326 on stationery and a total of Rs 212,491 on visibility and website.

# FUTURE OUTLOOK

Year 2023 promises to be one filled with ground-breaking projects for M-Kids. We have focused heavily on children and their well-being in the past couple of years, and we hope to continue doing this.

To combat domestic violence, of which children and women are often the victims, we expect to set up our emergency Safe Haven project this year. The issue of gender-based violence is continually present in society and in the news, and as an organisation that caters to the welfare of children, we believe it is of tantamount importance to build a safe place for them.

As our beneficiaries grow up, we are setting up a greenhouse or an aquaponics farm in Camp Chapelon. Statistics have spoken, we need more farmers to grow our foods locally. The aim of this environmental project is to encourage our young people to consider a career in agriculture and farming and encourage a sustainable mindset.

Finally, we are starting our IT Smartlab project. In a world that is fast becoming digitised, technology is key in breaking the generational cycle of poverty. We understand the importance of raising a group of tech-savvy and tech-ready children to tackle on the future.

Unfortunately, due to a lack of funds, the purchase of a vehicle was postponed to the next year. A vehicle would allow us greater mobility and ease, especially when it comes to food collection, pick-ups and drop-offs of our beneficiaries. We aspire to complete the purchase of the vehicle this year.

We remain committed to building stronger, resilient children, in a world where no child is left behind.
